GUIDE TO THE COSTA DEL SOL'S BEST STREET MARKETS

MONDAY	Marbella – Every Monday morning in the town's main fair ground (near the car dealerships at the entrance to Marbella). If you're driving, parking could be a problem! We recommend trying to park down by the fishing port and walking up to the market.
TUESDAY	• Fuengirola – The Fuengirola market is held at the Fair Ground in the town centre. Parking is a problem but it's worth the hassle as this is one of the biggest markets with loads of great stalls. You can get a bus straight to Fuengirola (n°120) from just outside Sunset Beach Club.
WEDNESDAY	 Benalmádena Costa/Arroyo de la Miel – Located at the fairground behind Paloma Park, this one is a favourite amongst our hotel guests as it's within walking distance. Please be advised that this is more of a car boot sale than a traditional flea market. La Cala de Mijas – Located in the fairground just off the A7 coastal road in La Cala de Mijas. You'll find a bit of everything at this market. Estepona – Located next to the fair ground. Again, this is quite a big market and one of the most popular in the area (western Costa del Sol).
THURSDAY	 Torremolinos – Located next to the Water Park. Just a short taxi ride from Sunset Beach Club. San Pedro de Alcántara – Another popular market and well known for its great variety of fresh produce. Parking is a little easier than at some of the other market venues.
FRIDAY	Arroyo de la Miel – This market is in the Tivoli World car park area. Guests staying at Sunset Beach Club can jump on the M103 bus just outside the hotel
SATURDAY	 Fuengirola – This is actually more like a car boot sale (The one on Tuesday is a proper street market) You'll find some really interesting and bargain items here. Puerto Banús – Although a bit further down the Coast this has to be one of the most popular markets on the coast. Lots of great stalls as well as a wide selection of antiques on sale. We recommend you park in one of the car parks in the port area and then walk up to the market. La Cala de Mijas – Similar to the one on Wednesdays this street market has a bit of everything and is a great excuse to visit this charming seaside town.
SUNDAY	 Torremolinos – Near the Water Park. Fuengirola – Located near the Mosque and the Sohail Castle. This is more of a flea market with lots of leather goods, souvenirs and gifts. Estepona – This popular Sunday market is located in Estepona Port and offers mainly clothing and leather goods. Málaga – The 'Zoco' in Malaga's Muelle Uno Waterfront offers food items, arts and crafts, decoration and fashion. (Be sure to check dates as it's not available every Sunday.

Please note that unless stated, these markets usually take place between 09:00h and 14:00h (weather permitting)
